Official Information Act Request - OIA 13002 Overdue Dental Cases

Under section 14 of the Official Information Act, the Whanganui District Health Board (WDHB) received a partial transfer of your request from the Ministry of Health on 21 July 2020. You requested the following information in relation to overdue dental cases.

1) Can you please let me know the current percentage of overdue cases across the Northern, Midland, Central and Southern regions— and how that compares to the past two years. What are the longest wait times? Where are they?

2019/2020

We currently have 16% of the preschool to year 8 patient group overdue in the Whanganui DHB area. The majority of these children became overdue during the March/April lockdown period, and come from all parts of the Whanganui area, both rural and city. One child has been waiting for 9 months, while another 13 children are overdue by 5 months. These fourteen children are overdue as a result of non-attendance at appointments or unavailability for appointments.

2018/2019

4% overdue - 6 months overdue for 5 children

2017/2018

2% overdue – 11 months overdue for 1 child; 6 months overdue for 8 children

2016/2017

3% overdue – 8 months overdue for 2; 6 months or less overdue for 40
