## Official Information Act Request - OIA 13247 Mental Health and Addiction Services

On 18 November 2020, under section 12 of the Official Information Act, you requested the following information from Whanganui District Health Board (WDHB):

For Maori and, separately, non-Maori, referred to mental health and addiction services at the DHB between 1 July, 2019 and 30 June, 2020:

- 1. Referral numbers for each service, e.g., child/adolescence/adult/older adult.
- 2. What psychiatric diagnoses did these people present with? Please provide numbers of people per diagnosis, e.g., deferred diagnosis 100; schizophrenia 100.
- 3. How many of those in point 1 and 2 were engaged with a psychologist for psychological assessment/treatment or both?
- 4. How many were prescribed medication? a. Of this number, how many were prescribed anti- psychotic medication?

### Whanganui District Health Boards response:

For Maori and, separately, non-Maori, referred to mental health and addiction services at the DHB between 1 July, 2019 and 30 June, 2020:

Child adolescent service: 176 Maori, 395 non-Maori SUPP adolescent AOD service: Maori, 86 non-Maori 58 Maternal mental health: Maori 40, non-Maori 92 Adult mental health: Maori 698, non-Maori 1,174

Older adult over 65 mental health: Maori 17, Non Maori 175

#### 2. What psychiatric diagnoses did these people present with?

Maternal/Child /adolescent services complete assessments prior to making diagnosis so referrals do not present with an official diagnosis.

For Mental Health and Addictions as a whole the following are the diagnoses recorded usually after a three month period (many crisis presentations do not receive a diagnosis and are coded as observation or assessment to reduce stigmatization):

# 3. How many of those in point 1 and 2 were engaged with a psychologist for psychological assessment/treatment or both?

For Maternal Child/adolescent services 74 clients were engaged with Psychologist. For Adult Mental health and addiction services 125 people engaged with a psychologist.

## 4. How many were prescribed medication? a. Of this number, how many were prescribed antipsychotic medication?

We are not able to obtain this information for DHB prescribing only at present as the information available pertains to all prescribing in the district (Pharms database) and not DHB only. (this is because DHB prescribing is not yet fully electronic).

From the Pharms database, in the period 1 July 2019 to 30 June 2020, 7960 persons domiciled in Whanganui district received a prescription for a psychotropic medication. 2170 persons domiciled in Whanganui district received prescriptions for an antipsychotic.








Psychotropic prescribing July 2019-June 2020 Whanganui District Domicile – all ages
