The national immunisation target is 85 percent of eightmonth-olds have their primary course of immunisation at six weeks, three months and five months on time by July 2013, 90 percent by July 2014 and 95 percent by December 2014. This quarterly progress result includes children who turned eight-months between April and June 2013 and who were fully immunised at that stage.
